



Overseas Senior Airport Fire Officer Programme

DURATION: 5 Weeks fully residential

TARGET GROUP

This course is designed for overseas personnel with previous Fire Service experience. It provides delegates with instruction and information regarding the management of RFFS capabilities and resource control:

- RFFS Capabilities including Training needs and task resource analysis (TRA & TNA).
- Incident Command System and the RFFS tactical operations.
- Post Accident considerations and dealing with the media
- Fire Safety.
- Licensing requirements (CAP 168, ICAO annex 14, OTAR requirements).
- Training skills (Planning and delivery of training)

PRE ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS

Trainees will need to have experience of Airport Fire and Rescue Services at Officer or potential Officer level and be able to communicate easily using the English language.

AIM

To meet the recommendations of Annex 14.

OBJECTIVES

At the end of this course the student will be able to:

- State the legislative (ICAO) requirements regarding the RFFS at aerodromes category 1-10.
- Define the tactics, techniques and actions required for dealing with a variety of aircraft situations.
Discuss the problems regarding evacuation of passengers and the Introduction of (PEMS) passenger evacuation management systems.
- Understand the Incident command system and the requirement of command support.
- Define the requirements for implementing breathing apparatus control procedures (UK Technical bulletin 1/97).
- Describe the management of preserving the scene at an aircraft accident.
- Understand the required control of RFFS medias and their impact on the environment.
- Identify the classifications of dangerous goods and their packaging.
- Define the hazards involved with radioactive materials and decontamination procedures required.
- Understand the requirement of training needs analysis and an effective station training programme.
- Understand the requirement and application of a task and resource analysis for RFFS capabilities.
- Discuss the management of emergency planning at an airport.
- Discuss the application of fire prevention measures for an airfield.

This course will also involve practical elements on the fireground, use of virtual reality simulator and external visits to an airport and manufacturers.
