Aims and Objectives

The ROC scheme has been designed in acknowledgement of, and to reflect the requirements of a number of IFTC stakeholders who expressed an interest in revalidating the Rescue Fire Fighting Services (RFFS) competence through a planned crew training cycle at IFTC. The objective is to provide: -

- CAA training assessment approval.
- Combining an assessment strategy embedded within their planned Crew Training days at IFTC.
- Developing competency based training portfolios for each role and individual..
- Candidate assessment reflection.
- Candidate personal development plan.

Outline of Programme

The ROC programme is designed to combine a planned airport crew training schedule with a robust assessment of competence through observation of skills, oral and written assessments. (The process of evaluation will be consistent and continuous using a portfolio of training records). Training records will be generated for each individual and will include:-

- The delegate role training plan.
- Details of training exercises and scenarios.
- Details of planned assessment schedules.
- Evidence and record of assessment results.
- Delegate's reflection of performance.
- Details of Cross mapping to CAP 699 standards of competence.
- Personal action plan

The ROC programme has been innovated to provide a highly-effective training/assessment intervention that fully meets the CAA requirements and delivers cost and operational benefits to airports that fall under its jurisdiction.



Occupational standards

CAP 699 – Standards for the Competence of Rescue and Firefighting Service Personnel contains the national occupational standards for each of the RFFS roles. This programme provides delegates with opportunities to demonstrate their application of skills and knowledge mapped to their role. It is important that delegates understand CAP 699 as it contains standards against which performance will be assessed.

The ROC Programme has three main functions which are:-

- Provide the delegate with relevant underpinning knowledge that is appropriate to the role and stage of their development through the aerodromes station training programme and the IFTC iLearn portal.
- Teach and assess the skills relevant to the delegate's role and stage of development.
- Assess an individual's development to ensure that they have successfully acquired competence in the areas of CAP 699 which will be covered during the programme.
